Whether its purchasing a new piece of equipment, attending physical therapy appointments, or assisting with hospital bills, I hope you know how much you are changing these individuals' lives. KAT6A and KAT6B gene mutations effect all aspects of one's life, (physical, mental, and verbal) so these services are essential to help them thrive.

Kettner receives three therapies a week, and has 5-6 specialty doctors appointments per month. Because of these services, he has come so far in just the first year and a half. He can now sit up all on his own, something I truly never thought I would see him do. His progress comes from all the therapies he receives, and I know same can be true for other families with a KAT6 loved one. However, while our family is blessed to be in a State and County that help cover many of these costs, we know that for most other KAT6 families, to cover these costs out of pocket can be a financial burden.

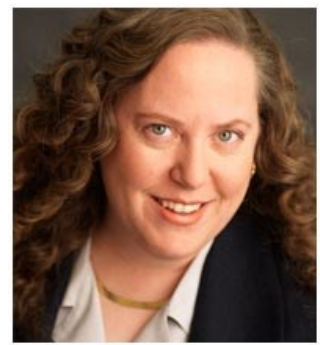

Holiday Traditions by Linda Grisé

Being of British heritage and coming from the East Coast the following are traditions I grew up with and passed on to my children.

Why do we hang stockings?

Legend has it that a 4th-century nobleman was a widower with three daughters and could not afford their dowries. Hearing of this father's dilemma, Saint Nicholas secretly tossed three gold spheres down the man's chimney because he knew the man would not accept any charity. The gold spheres ended up in the daughters' stockings, which were hanging above the fireplace to dry. With the gold, the daughters were now eligible to marry and the father was so overjoyed, he eventually found out who had left the gold and told everyone about Nicholas. While this far-fetched tale is difficult to believe, the myth is widely accepted as the origin story for the humble Christmas stocking.

Why do we send cards at Christmas?

The British Christmas tradition of sending cards dates all the way back to 1843. At the time, a gentleman named [Sir Henry Cole](#) didn't have time to send personal messages, so he hired an artist called John Calcott Horsley to design him a card which he could send to lots of people, and that's how Christmas cards were born.

Why do we hang Mistletoe?

The tradition of hanging mistletoe in the house goes back to the times of the ancient Druids. It is supposed to possess mystical powers which bring good luck to the household and ward off evil spirits. Today, kissing under the mistletoe is a great tradition that appears to have first caught on in the 18th century among servants in England before spreading to the middle classes. As part of the early custom, men were allowed to steal a kiss from any woman caught standing under the mistletoe, and refusing was viewed as bad luck.

What are Christmas Crackers?

These festive table decorations are pulled apart to reveal a small gift, a party hat and a riddle or a joke at Christmas parties, lunches and dinners in the UK. They were invented by a London sweet maker called Tom Smith in 1845-1850. He got the idea from French 'bon bon' sweets (almonds wrapped in paper), but added a small saying or riddle within the wrapping of his sweets. They didn't sell well at first, so to make them more popular, he created a bang. He added tiny fireworks and launched a new range of crackers called 'Bangs of Expectation!' in 1861. And so the Christmas cracker was born.

What is Boxing Day?

Boxing Day is a British public holiday on 26th December, the day directly after Christmas day. And, although there's a lot of different theories about the origins of Boxing Day, it is generally thought that the day was created for people to 'box up' their unwanted gifts and give them to the poor who had nothing. It was also a holiday for the tradesmen who received a 'boxing,' or gift, the day after Christmas. Nowadays, many Brits use their day off on Boxing Day to travel and visit their relatives and eat your bodyweight in turkey sandwiches, or hit the sales and pick up a bargain.

Loaded Potato Soup by Diana Pedersen Coe



1 package (12 oz) bacon	4 cups milk
1 package (12 oz) bacon	1 teaspoon salt
1 1/2 cups chopped onion	1 teaspoon freshly ground pepper
6 cups chicken broth	1 cup diced cooked ham
2 lb baking potatoes, peeled, cubed	1 container (8 oz) sour cream
2/3 cup butter	2 1/2 cups shredded sharp Cheddar cheese (10 oz)
3/4 cup all-purpose flour	3/4 cup sliced green onions

Steps

1

In 12-inch skillet, cook bacon over medium heat 6 to 7 minutes or until crisp; drain on paper towels. Crumble bacon; set aside. Reserve 2 tablespoons drippings in skillet. Cook onion in bacon drippings over medium-high heat 6 minutes or until almost tender.

2

In 6-quart Dutch oven, mix onion, broth and potatoes. Heat to boiling; reduce heat. Cook 10 minutes or until potatoes are very tender.

3

Meanwhile, in same skillet, melt butter over low heat. Stir in flour with whisk until smooth. Cook and stir 1 minute. Gradually stir in 2 cups of the milk. Pour milk mixture into potato mixture. Add remaining 2 cups milk, the salt and pepper. Cook over medium heat, stirring constantly with whisk, until mixture is thickened and bubbly.

4

Stir in ham, half of the bacon, the sour cream, 2 cups of the cheese and 1/2 cup of the green onions. Cook until thoroughly heated and cheese is melted. Evenly top individual servings with remaining bacon, 1/2 cup cheese and 1/4 cup green onions.

Use a TV to charge devices: If you forget to bring your plug adapter or the room lacks enough outlets, remember that many modern TV's have a USB slot that can be used for charging devices.

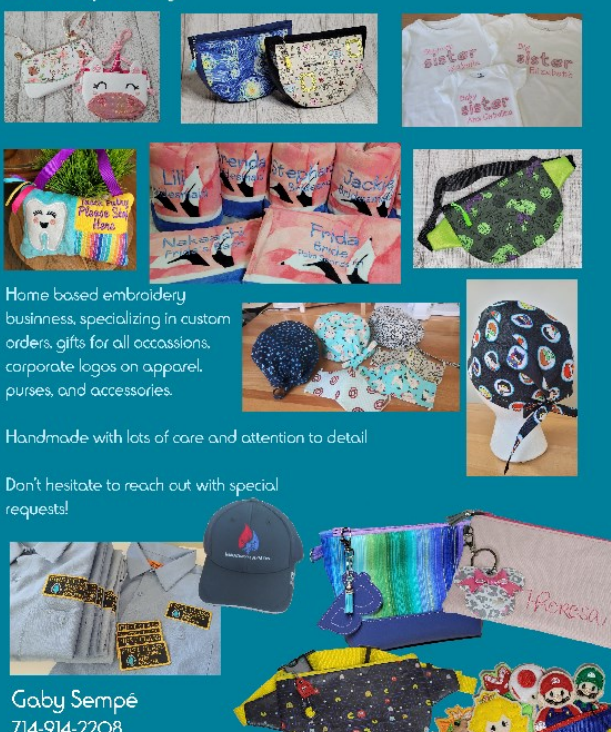
